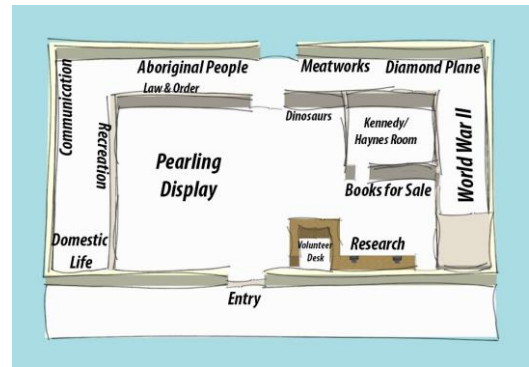

2. Can you find an object or image which shows how life for local Aboriginal people may have changed after European settlers came to the area? Describe it.

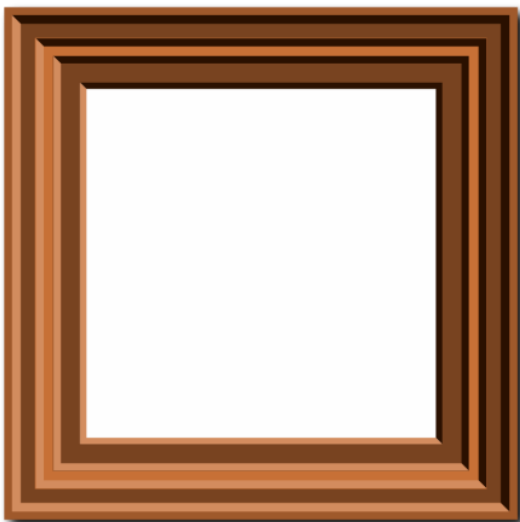
Section D: Wartime

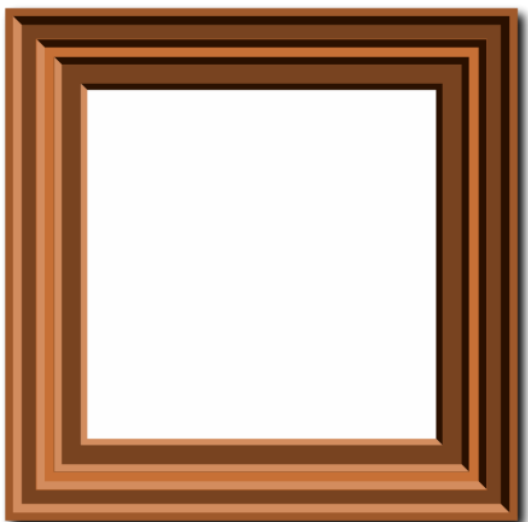

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Concluding activity: My visit

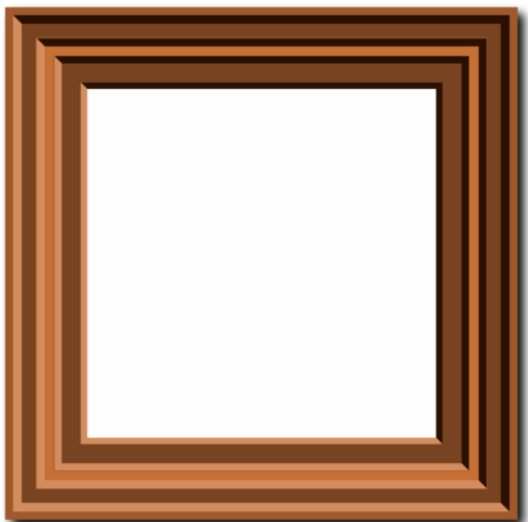
